Chapter 1. Administration

1.1 Scope.

- **1.1.2** This standard shall not apply to the following:
- (1) Ignitable (flammable and combustible) liquids produced in underground coal mines.

Note: the above specific text edit change is universally applied throughout the standard where mentioned.

- 1.2 Purpose. This standard shall be intended for the use and guidance of those charged with designing, constructing, purchasing, testing, installing, examining, approving, operating, or maintaining fire prevention, fire protection, or firefighting equipment in underground bituminous coal mines, coal preparation plants, and surface mining equipment and processes.
- **1.3.2** At times it will be necessary for those responsible for the storage of ignitable (flammable and combustible) liquids and the used of diesel-powered equipment within underground bituminous coal mines to consult an experienced fire protection specialist, and it shall be permitted.

Chapter 1. Administration

1.1* Scope.

- **1.1.2** As applies to underground mining, this standard shall cover only the following:
- (2) Storage and handling of ignitable (flammable and combustible) liquids.

Note: this specific text edit change is universally applied throughout the standard where mentioned.

- **1.1.3** As applies to underground mining, this standard shall not cover ignitable (flammable and combustible) liquids produced in underground coal mines, such as shale oil mines.
- **1.2 Purpose.** This standard shall be intended for the use by those Charged with fire prevention and fire protection or with responsibility for purchasing, designing, installing, testing, inspecting, approving, listing, operating or maintaining the following:
- (2) Facilities and equipment for the storage and handling of ignitable (flammable and combustible) liquids within underground metal and nonmetal mines.

Foam Extinguisher Agent and Recharge Disposal

The intent of this special report is to address the disposal of pre-mixed foam solutions utilized in foam extinguishers.

Fluorinated Class B firefighting foam has played an important role in the protection of flammable and combustible liquid risks over many decades. The ability of foam to rapidly extinguish flammable or combustible liquid spill or in-depth fires by separating the vapor from the fuel has effectively led to reduced property loss, lives saved, and minimized pollution that can result from the uncontrolled burning of flammable or combustible liquid fuels.

Yet, increased worldwide environmental awareness on the use of fluorinated Class B foam has focused on the potential adverse environmental impact of the foam solution discharge. Of primary concern is persistence in the environment, biodegradability in water and soil, toxicity levels, treatability in waste-water treatment plants, and mobility.

NFPA Requirements

NFPA 10, Standard for Portable Fire Extinguishers (2022 ed.) details the General Requirements (Chapter 4), Selection of Portable Fire Extinguishers (Chapter 5), and Inspection, Maintenance, and Recharging (Chapter 7), and Hydrostatic Testing (Chapter 8) of foam fire extinguishers both Aqueous Film-Forming Foam (AFFF) and Film-Forming Fluoroprotein (FFFP) types.

Chapter 7: Inspection, Maintenance & Recharge

- 7.3.3 Annual Internal Examination of Certain types of Extinguishers.
 - 7.3.3.1* Maintenance Intervals. Fire Extinguishers shall be internally examined at intervals not exceeding those specified in Table 7.3.3.1.

Extinguisher Type	Internal Examination Interval (years)
AFFF (Aqueous Film-Forming Foam)	3†
FFFP (Film-Forming Fluoroprotein Foam)	3†

[†] The extinguishing agent in liquid charge-type AFFF and FFFP extinguishers is replaced every 3 years, and an internal examination (teardown) is normally conducted at this time.

- 7.8.2 Extinguisher Recharging Frequency for Certain Types of Extinguishers.
 - o 7.8.2.3 AFFF and FFFP.

7.8.2.3.1 The premixed agent in liquid charge-type AFFF and FFFP fire extinguishers shall be replaced following the fire extinguisher manufacturer's instructions, not to exceed the 5-year hydrostatic test interval.

7.8.2.3.2 Only the foam agent specified on the extinguisher nameplate shall be used for recharge. **7.8.2.3.3** The agent in non-pressurized AFFF and FFFP fire extinguishers that is subject to agent analysis in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions shall not be required to comply with **7.8.2.3.1**.

Chapter 8: Hydrostatic Testing

- 8.3 Frequency.
 - 8.3.1 General. At intervals not exceeding those specified in Table 8.3.1, fire extinguishers shall be hydrostatically retested.

Foam Agent Disposal

When disposing of existing premixed agent in liquid chargetype foam extinguishers or unused foam agent charges it is recommended that you consult the manufacturer's service manual or manufacturer's instructions for guidance. If no specific guidance/information is provided, contact the manufacturer directly.

Please be aware many states and/or provinces have existing laws, rules, and/or regulations pertaining to the disposal of PFAS substances. Please consult your local resource(s) as appropriate.

The family of compounds known as per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) used in consumer and industrial manufacturing are persistent in the environment and are comprised of over 6,000 compounds. The most widely known compounds in this group are perfluorooctanesulfonic acid (PFOS) and perfluorooctanoic acid (PFOA). PFAS registered waste disposal firms are versed in the nomenclature, analysis methods, and treatment of these compounds. These companies can guide customers through the process of testing, treatment, and final deposition and destruction of their specific materials and media. 

Service Trade Publishes Performance Metrics for Fire & Life Safety Contractors

The updated 2022 ServiceTrade Benchmark Report enables fire and life safety contractors to see how they stack up against industry peers. The report contains new data for the calendar year of 2022 and was published in April 2023.

This benchmark report consists of comparative performance data compiled from hundreds of ServiceTrade customers in the fire and life safety industry. Performance for the 25th, 50th, and 75th percentiles of mechanical contractors are included in each chart. Five KPIs were charted: On-Time Completion Rate, Days to Invoice, Pull-Through Work Rate, Pull-Through Work's Impact On Growth, and Year-Over-Year Revenue Growth.

On-Time Completion Rate

On-Time Completion Rate measures the percent of work orders that were completed in the time in which they were due.

Top Performers – 86% Middle Performers – 78% Bottom Performers – 72%

Days to Invoice

Days to Invoice is calculated by averaging the number of calendar days between the last appointment on a job and the transacted date of the first invoice for all jobs with a transacted invoice in the same time period.

Top Performers – 2 Days Middle Performers – 5 Days Bottom Performers – 11 Days

Pull-Through Work Rate

Pull-through work includes repairs, upgrades, replacements, and installations that come from existing relationships with the customer. Anything you've proactively suggested or planned with your customer outside of routine maintenance and construction work.

*For top-performing fire and life safety contractors in this category, 19% of all work orders fell into the category of pull-through work.

Top Performers – 19% Middle Performers – 13% Bottom Performers – 6%

Pull-Through Work's Impact on Growth

The top half of fire and life safety contractors in total pull-through performance grew year-over-year revenue 14% faster than their bottom half performing counterparts.

Year-Over-Year Revenue Growth

Year-Over-Year Revenue Growth is calculated by totaling all transacted invoice revenue from the period year and dividing by the total transacted invoice revenue from the previous year.

CPSC WARNING STATEMENT

The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) is warning consumers about the risk of burns and smoke inhalation associated with the use of LVYXON, TATTCHINE, ARMYJY, PETSTIBLE, HelloPharma, Vixuiyz, and JHEUAYK brand fire extinguisher balls sold on Amazon. com. These products can fail to extinguish a fire, which could lead to serious injury and death.

Specifically, the identified products can fail to properly disperse fire suppressing chemicals and fail to extinguish a fire. In addition, the products do not have a pressure gauge or pressure indicator, a locking device to reduce the risk of unintentional discharge, a self-closing valve for intermittent discharge, or a nozzle to direct the discharge. These products fail to meet the requirements of UL 299 Dry Chemical Fire Extinguishers, UL 711 Rating and Fire Testing of Fire Extinguishers, and NFPA 10 Standard for Portable Fire Extinguishers which are voluntary safety standards.

The fire extinguisher balls were sold to consumers on Amazon.com. They are made of red plastic, with an approximate diameter ranging between 4 and 7 inches. They weigh between 1 and 3 pounds. The products also include a stand that can be mounted to the wall. The products typically have a label wrapped around the entire product with orange and red lettering stating Fire Extinguisher Ball and XRT Auto Fire Off or AFO Auto Fire Off. The fire extinguisher balls were sold on Amazon.com for between \$25 and \$120. LVYXON was sold under ASINs B0BCPL2QY8 and B0BCPH6M9L. TATTCHINE was sold under ASINs B0BCYXZ5H9 and B0BCYWR1VH. ARMYJY was sold under ASIN B0BB6Y1JQQ. PETSTIBLE was sold under ASINs B0BD3RL3K9 and B0BD3T4BNX. HelloPharma was sold under ASIN B09YNKKKM2. Vixuiyz was sold under ASIN B09YRRL241. JHEUAYK was sold under ASINs B0BCQ121VL and B0BCWR36DQ.

CPSC urges consumers not to purchase or sell these fire extinguisher balls. Consumers should stop using them and dispose of these products at either a local fire department or a hazardous waste disposal facility. Consumers should only purchase fire extinguishers that meet both the UL 299 and UL 711 safety standards and are marked with those certifications.


